**Santa Monica Bar Association Invites Jackson Center to California  
For Commemoration of Holocaust Remembrance Day**

The Santa Monica Bar Association has invited the Robert H. Jackson Center to participate in a Los Angeles area event commemorating the Holocaust and the Nuremberg Trials, as a benefit for the Jackson Center.

Entitled, "The Legacy of Justice Robert Jackson...60 Years after Nuremberg," the event will take place at the Skirball Convention Center in Los Angeles, at 6 p.m. Tuesday, April 25.

Rolland E. Kidder, Executive Director of the Jackson Center, and Whitney R. Harris, one of the surviving prosecutors of Nuremberg who participates as an advisor to and a participant in Jackson Center programs, will be hosted at the event by the Bar Association.

Mr. Kidder will address the legacy of Justice Jackson who was asked by President Harry S. Truman to represent the United States as Chief Prosecutor at Nuremberg and who took a leave of absence from the Supreme Court in 1945 to honor that request. Mr. Kidder will provide videotaped footage of the Nuremberg Trials followed by a question/answer period.

Mr. Harris, author of "Tyranny on Trial," and two smaller volumes written specifically for the Jackson Center, will discuss his experiences in Nuremberg, the challenges of his investigations, the impact of Justice Jackson's role in insuring fair and legitimate trials at Nuremberg, and the relevance of those principles to current issues. Mr. Harris was awarded the Legion of Merit for his work at the Nuremberg Trial.

"We are extremely gratified by this opportunity provided to us by the Santa Monica Bar Association," says Mr. Kidder. "The Bar Association became acquainted with us through our website at [www.roberthjackson.org](http://www.roberthjackson.org) <<http://www.roberthjackson.org/>> and approached us to participate in this program. The Bar Association is underwriting costs of our involvement and will provide the Jackson Center with a portion of the proceeds from the program."

"The participation of the Santa Monica Bar Association in the Robert H. Jackson Center is heartening and also indicates once more that the Jackson Center's reach extends beyond our physical location," notes Mr. Kidder. "The success of the Jackson Center, due to the support of our community, plays a large part in the community renewal of our Greater Jamestown Area."
